



**Creative Ways to Use the Unit:**

- Traditional Method: Choose 4 students a limited time frame in which to write a poem.
- Extra Challenge Method: In-Class Challenges.
  - Take it to the next level by using unfamiliar words.
  - Require students to use their dictionary.
  - Ask volunteers to read their poem randomly choose one of the words; the class pick the next set of words.
  - Use three of the Dive Deep Word Strip. This can serve as a writing exercise!
  - Try giving students more time than they really explore their ideas.
  - Have an Out of the Box contest; winner can come up with their own class "vessel."
  - Decorate a bulletin board using the strips with the poems your class has written.
  - Use the blank cards to come up with a class novel.
  - Have students work in cooperatively have them write a group poem about a specific book, theme, or topic.
  - If you can think of other ways to use the strips.

**Out of the Box Poetry Quickwrites**

**The only difference between the Seahorse and Starfish Word Strips is the design.**

**Overview:**

The concept is simple: assign your students a words that they have to use in a poem. Give them 5 or 10 minutes to write and enjoy writing the words they!

The words may seem random, but they are carefully chosen to inspire imagery and imagination. They have multiple meanings. Since verbs and nouns work best, the Seahorse and Starfish Word Strips include two adjectives. It is best to start this way, because when given nouns that just results in strange poems about fluffy bunnies or small dinosaurs!

At the beginning, I prohibit rhyming poems. It's just a personal preference. I feel that allowing rhyming just results in forced rhyming, which I call the "I love my puppy as much as my puppy" phenomenon.

Begin by printing the strips, you can print on cardstock or paper, or you can even print them on paper and laminate them. Then you will cut out the Seahorse and Starfish Word Strips and place them in bins, or in 1/2" containers like a vessel. I use a decorative box and students are very enthusiastic when they see me pull it out!

**Treasure Chest Word Strips** are the challenge strips requiring students to either include a specific literary device or write a certain form of poetry. I keep mine in a separate bin. I don't always use them, but when I do I sometimes present them as a "bonus challenge" for purpose descriptive poems.

**Dive Deep Word Strips** are strips composed entirely of adjectives and adverbs. They can be used in conjunction with the other strips or they can be used alone for interesting descriptive poems.
